Student target group

- All students in your country, i.e. national and foreign students who are pursuing their studies for a degree in the country of the survey1, except students on leave and excluding students on incoming and outgoing credit mobility.
- Full-time and part-time students by status.
- Students in all ISCED 5, 6 and 7 programmes, regardless of their character as general or professional, as long as the programmes are considered higher education in your national context.2
- All higher education institutions offering programmes considered "normal". In many cases this means only public, non-specialist institutions of higher education.
- All national degrees corresponding to ISCED 5, 6 and 7 (e.g. BA, MA, traditional diploma, Lizentiat, national degrees in medicine. Short courses only if they are based on ISCED 5.)
- Distance students who study at a "normal" higher education institution, i.e. excluding institutions solely for long distance students like open universities, Fernuniversität Hagen and similar.

Adaption to national contexts

- Problem: Diversity of HE in participating countries
- Solution: Background knowledge to adapt questionnaire to national contexts
- Two goals to achieve
 - Comparability across Europe
 - Suitability for students
